Why?

All fluorescent lighting contains small amounts of mercury. Mercury is hazardous to your health, which is why California banned fluorescent lamps from disposal in the trash. If improperly placed in the trash, they break and mercury is released.

A recent study conducted in the San Gabriel Valley found that 45% of mercury-containing lamps are being thrown in the trash!
