RE: AB 1200 (Ting) Safer Food Packaging and Cookware Act of 2021 - SUPPORT

Dear Governor Newsom:

On behalf of the undersigned organizations, we write to urge your signature on AB 1200, which would prohibit the sale of paper-based food packaging containing PFAS, require the disclosure of chemicals of concern for human health and the environment in cookware, and prohibit cookware companies from making misleading marketing claims.

Per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS) are a class of approximately 9,000 man-made chemicals used for a wide range of purposes, including food packaging and cookware. They are called "forever" chemicals because they are extremely resistant to breaking down in nature. Californians are exposed to them through the manufacturing and use of PFAS-containing products, ingesting contaminated drinking water or food, and via air pollution.

PFAS have been linked to severe health problems, including breast and other cancers, hormone disruption, kidney and liver damage, thyroid disease, and immune system disruption. The entire class of PFAS chemicals has been recognized as chemicals of concern by a wide array of scientific experts at the state and federal level. As we cope with a worldwide pandemic, research suggesting PFAS may reduce the immune system's response to vaccinations has compounded the medical, scientific and political concern.

Federal regulation of food packaging and cookware is inadequate, allowing hazardous chemicals in these products. The result is exposure of people and the environment from the manufacturing, use, and disposal of these products.

Single use paper-based food packaging is often coated with PFAS, which can migrate from treated paper wraps, bags, dinnerware and takeout containers into food. When this packaging is composted, the chemicals can re-enter the food chain through compost treated soils. Additionally, food packaging

contributes to PFAS contamination of our waterways through manufacturing releases, litter and by leaching from landfills.

Consumers are also concerned with chemical exposure from **cookware**. A recent report by the Ecology Center¹ found either the PFAS chemical PTFE (polytetrafluoroethylene) or the hormone disrupting chemical bisphenol A (BPA) in a majority of the tested cookware. Yet there are no federal or state laws requiring disclosure of any chemicals in cookware. California would be the first state to act on this important right to know issue.

Moreover, several of the tested cookware items advertised that they did not contain a specific PFAS chemical – PFOA – even though the cookware contained PTFE, another form of PFAS. This misleading "PFOA-free" marketing gives consumers the false impression they are buying PFAS-free cookware. AB 1200 prohibits a marketing claim that a product is free of a specific chemical if the product contains another chemical belonging to the same chemical class and if that class is included on the Department of Toxic Substances Control Candidate Chemicals list.

The existing lack of transparency leads the public to unknowingly expose themselves to chemicals of concern. For example, pans may off-gas chemicals when subjected to high heat or may expose a consumer to hazardous chemicals from coatings that are scratched or peeling. Chemicals of concern in cookware may also contribute to pollution both during manufacturing and disposal.

This bill addresses these issues by banning the sale of paper-based food packaging that contains intentionally added PFAS; requiring, for the first time ever, cookware manufacturers to disclose intentionally added chemicals of concern that are in the parts that contact food and in the handles; and prohibiting misleading marketing claims.

For these reasons, we strongly support and respectfully request your signature on AB 1200.
