

## **Nate Pelczar, Program Manager, CPSC**

Nate joined the California Product Stewardship Council (CPSC) in 2018 as a Program Manager. Mr. Pelczar manages CPSC's largest grant project, the California Drug Take-Back Program (DTBP), via a \$3 million grant from California Department of Health Care Services to combat the opioid epidemic. The grant allows CPSC to install over 300 medicine take-back bins to communities across California which will ultimately be taken-over by the drug producers when [SB 212](#) (a bill driven by CPSC), is implemented by 2022. Mr. Pelczar is also involved in the management of over a dozen grants related to the reduction of household hazardous waste, single-use propane cylinders, and other material management issues.



Nate has spent much of the last 15 years as a management consultant, compliance subject matter expert, and financial analyst serving public sector clients (federal, state, and local governments), private sector clients (financial institutions, software companies, and retail services), and non-government organizations. Mr. Pelczar brings high level team, budget, and project management experience to CPSC.

During his time as a management consultant, Nate developed a number of areas of expertise, including anti-money laundering, international tax (transfer pricing), domestic tax (sales and use tax), international and domestic statutory and regulatory compliance, financial and performance auditing, education and training development, program and project management, budgeting and financial analysis, business process re-engineering, enterprise resource planning and implementation, and policy analysis and development.

During Nate's time with Deloitte as Chief of Staff to a Global Senior Partner, he managed a wide variety of projects for clients such as Amazon, Walmart, Apple, Microsoft, eBay, Expedia, IBM, Intel, Monsanto, and Biogen. As a financial analyst for RagingWire, one of the nation's largest data center colocation providers, Nate managed an operating budget for over 20 departments and managed a capital budget in excess of \$600MM.

Nate's support and passion for the environment aligns well with CPSC's focus on producer responsibility policy and driving a circular economy. His skills and experience working with large corporations continue to help CPSC grow working collaboratively with the private sector to implement public policies in the areas of the environment and the economy.

Nate received a Master of Public Affairs degree from Indiana University in 2005 with a major in public policy analysis and an emphasis in non-profit management.
